

PREPARE YOUR ROOM

Make your room exciting, thematic, and unforgettable! Take pictures of the existing set-up (for re-assembly at the end of the week). Change the bulletin boards. Rearrange chairs and tables. Create learning areas that are functional and fun. (See the Decorating Handbook for more information.)

PREPARE YOUR LESSON

Know your material. Collect props and teaching tools. Be pointed, punctual, and personal. Words may soon be forgotten but visual and personal illustrations will often be remembered for a lifetime.

Set goals you wish to accomplish this week and then strive to achieve them so Christ is glorified.

Every child in your class deserves to know the truth! Your job is to teach them how to discern right from wrong and instill in them a love for God's Word. Love them like Christ. Remember, God promises to bless those that seek after Him with their whole heart. (Psalm 119:2)

- · Be changed forever by the power of God.
- · Lead countless people to Christ because you faithfully presented the gospel. (Such was the case of D. L. Moody because of his Sunday School teacher.)

PREPARE YOUR PATH

As much as possible, design creative traffic plans to get from one location to another. Do activities (quiet or noisy) that reinforce the theme and your teaching. If you have a plan, your students will follow. Make every moment count. Teachable moments happen all the time! Time is too valuable to waste!

NOTE: Your Assistants are responsible for keeping children organized in line, monitoring behavior, and taking children to the restroom.

PREPARE FOR EMERGENCIES

Check your church's safety procedures. Instruct your helpers what to do and where to go in case of storm, illness, or accidents.

INTRODUCTION

Today in the Power-Up Rally, we learned that God has power over the spheres! Can you name some of them? Take answers: Earth, planets, litho, hydro, atmo, bio, etc. Excellent! There are spheres all around us and we live on a sphere. What is it called? Take answers: Earth, the world. That's right! Pick up globe beach ball.

God is so powerful; He keeps all the spheres in order and never "drops the ball!" Show globe beach ball. Speaking of dropping the ball, let's see if you can keep this sphere from hitting the floor! Toss the ball up over the students and let them stand and play a game of Keep Up for a minute. Seat students at the end of the game. Wow! You did an awesome job, but it isn't as easy as it looks, is it?

BIBLE LESSON REVIEW



THE SPHERES

GREEN CLASS NOTE | For this section, you may just want to review the 4 spheres by holding up the representative items (rock, pinwheel, cup of water, plant or animal toy) and giving examples of how God demonstrated His power over each sphere without going into detail.

Earlier, we found out that God has power over the earth's four spheres. Let's see if we can 1) remember what each sphere represents, and 2) discover how God demonstrated His power over it!

LITHOSPHERE | Our first sphere is the lithosphere. Do you remember what "litho" means? Answer: rocky crust. Yes! Hold up a rock. Rocky crust!

VERSE | JEREMIAH 51:15A

From spheres as big as planets and stars in the universe, to tiny particles of vapor in the atmosphere, God made all things by His power! In fact, our verse for today, Jeremiah 51:15a, teaches us that very thing!

Let's practice Jeremiah 51:15a together! Teach the verse using one of the suggestions on page 16, or (for older classes) consider writing the verse reference and words on large rocks and placing them in a basket. The children can take turns pulling rocks out of the basket and putting them in the correct order.

Great work, Citizens!

FUN FACT

Citizens, did you know you can earn 1,000 points at registration by saying your verse? This helps you and our team earn prizes! And, more importantly, you'll plug into God's power by hiding His Word in your heart.

Long ago, the earth looked much different than it does today. You see, because the people did not obey God, the Bible tells us the earth was covered in a world-wide flood! (Sometimes we call it Noah's flood because Noah obeyed God and built a big boat called an "ark." We'll learn more about Noah and his ark on another day!)

The lithosphere is made up of rocky plates that float on the earth's mantle, which is kind of like hot lava. Genesis



7:11 tells us that, during the flood, the fountains of the great deep were broken up! The plates in the lithosphere moved and buckled. This is how many of the mountain ranges we see today were formed! For instance, geologists (people that study the earth) believe that the Appalachian Mountains (show picture, if possible) were formed when Africa's plate slammed into North America's plate. Use your arms and hands to demonstrate the making of a mountain by aiming the tips of your fingers at each other and pointing them upward when they meet to form a peak. You can also see the bends in the rock layers when you look at the Grand Canyon! Show picture. Isn't God's power incredible!?

ATMOSPHERE | Our next sphere means "vapor" or "air"? Can you guess which sphere it is? Answer: atmosphere. Correct! The atmosphere is the layer of gasses that protects the earth. Just like you need a blanket to keep you warm, God knew that we needed the atmosphere to keep us from freezing at night or burning up from the heat of the sun during the day.

The lowest layer of the atmosphere is where almost all weather events occur. People that study patterns in the weather or changes in the atmosphere are called meteorologists. Have you ever watched a meteorologist on TV and heard them say (use an official-sounding voice), "Partly cloudy today with a 30% chance of rain." or, "70% chance of thunderstorms."? They have to say "chance" because they don't really know for sure what is going to happen or when. But God is the one that controls the weather! Every weather prediction He makes will happen 100% of the time!

In 1 Kings 17, God's prophet, Elijah, told wicked King Ahab there would be no rain for 3 years! And guess what!? It didn't rain until God said for it to rain 3 years later! Read (or have a student read) 1 Kings 18:1 from the Bible.

Mark 4 tells us of another time God showed his power over the atmosphere. God's Son, Jesus, and his disciples (the men that followed him) were in a boat and a "great storm of wind" came up suddenly. The disciples were afraid because of the storm, but do you know what Jesus was doing? Answer: sleeping. Sleeping! That's right! He wasn't afraid of the storm at all! Do you think you would be sleeping if you were in a boat during a storm? I probably wouldn't be! The disciples woke Jesus up because they thought they were going to die! Let's read verses 39-41 to find out what happens. Read (or have a student read) Mark 4:39-41. Wow! What an amazing display of power!

HYDROSPHERE | Speaking of waves, that reminds me of our next sphere! Can you guess what it is? The _____! Answer: hydrosphere. Correct! Hydro means _____. Answer: water. Where do we find water here on earth? Take answers: lakes, rivers, seas, oceans, springs, etc. Yes, water is all around us! The Bible records many times God showed his power over the hydrosphere. Can you think of an example? Take answers or summarize/read some of the following passages: Noah's Flood—Genesis 7:6-20 & 8:1-3, Parting the Red Sea (atmo- and hydrospheres)—Exodus 14:13-23 & 14:26-29, Parting the Jordan River—Joshua 3:7-17, and Jesus walking on water—Matthew 14:22-33. God's power over this mighty force of nature is incredible!

BIOSPHERE | Nature is full of wonderful things to see! That brings us to our next sphere—the biosphere! Raise your hand if you can name something in the biosphere. Take answers: people, plants, trees, animals, etc. Excellent! Yes, living things make up the biosphere!

Genesis 2:7 says (read from Bible or have a student read), "And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." This man's name was Adam, and God gave him a wife named Eve. All people are descendants of (or come from) Adam and Eve! That means you are a part of the wonderful biosphere God created! Just like He has a special purpose for each animal and plant, He has a special purpose for you and He loves you very much!

REINFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

BASKETSPHERE | Pick up globe beach ball, toss it in the air, and catch it. Now, let's play some "Basketsphere" and see how much you remember about the spheres! See Basketsphere box.

JOB VS. GOD

Job thought he knew it all (Job 38:5, 18, 21, 33; 39:1), but after God asked him over 60 questions and showed him all these spheres, Job repented and came to the conclusion that only God knows everything and can do everything. Instead of acting and speaking like a "know-it-all," Job decided it was best to put his hand over his mouth and repent of his prideful attitude.



CHARACTER TRAIT | HONOR

Job learned a lesson in honoring the Lord. Remember "honor" means "showing respect". Each day this week we will be looking for someone to honor who demonstrates the daily character trait.

APPLICATION

TALKING POINT 01

THINK & DISCUSS | How can you show respect to the people and spheres God created? Give examples: be kind to others, don't litter, be respectful of other people's property, don't be destructive to nature, etc.

ACTION STEP | Commit to showing honor to others and other people's things.

TALKING POINT 02

THINK & DISCUSS | Have you, like Job, had a disrespectful "know-it-all" attitude toward God or someone else?

ACTION STEP | Is there someone you need to apologize to for having a disrespectful attitude?



TALKING POINT 03

THINK & DISCUSS | God created the world and everything in it, including you, for a very special purpose. What is something you like about yourself?

ACTION STEP | Have you thanked God for creating you? If not, this is a great time to do it!

INVITATION

God is all-powerful and created this world and everything in it, including the spheres and you, for His glory! (Revelation 4:11) It was a perfect creation. There wasn't any sin—that means people didn't do bad things—and there wasn't any death. But when Adam and Eve, the first people God created, chose to disobey God, sin entered the world and so did death. (Romans 5:12) Did that mean that God was not in control? No! God gave man a choice, and man chose to disobey. The Bible tells us in Romans 5:19 (read from Bible), "for as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners..." Because we all come from Adam, all people are sinners. That includes you and me! As sinners, we deserve to die. We don't deserve God's forgiveness, but God loves us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to save us from our sin!

Jesus came to Earth and lived a perfect life, but wicked men convinced the leaders to kill Him. Jesus paid the price for our sins by dying on a cross, one of the most horrible ways to die, but He did it because He loves us. Through the power of God, Jesus rose again! God wants all of us to be saved so we can live forever with Him! All we have to do is believe in Jesus and accept His free gift of salvation. If you would like to talk with us about how you can accept Jesus as your Savior, please talk with us!

Close in prayer. (Call to action ideas: salvation, gratitude for God's power, committing to show honor, etc.)
